What Is Safeguarding?

Safeguarding means keeping you safe, happy, and healthy at school. It's about making sure you feel protected from harm, treated with respect, and supported in every way.

Our Goal

At ADNOC Schools, we want to:

- Keep you safe from harm, bullying, and abuse.
- Make sure you feel secure and supported.
- Listen to you and take your concerns seriously.
- Help you learn in a safe and caring environment.

Everyone - teachers, staff, parents, and even students - has a role in keeping our schools safe.

What You Should Know

- You have the right to feel safe and be treated fairly.
- If something doesn't feel right, you can talk to a trusted adult.
- Your voice matters - we want to hear your ideas and concerns.
- You can get help and support if you're feeling upset or unsafe.

Who Helps Keep You Safe?

Here are some of the key people who look out for you:

- **Principal & Teachers:** Make sure school is a safe place.
- **Safeguarding Leads:** Special staff trained to help with safety concerns.
- **Counsellors & Nurses:** Support your health and wellbeing.
- **Security Staff:** Keep the school physically safe.
- **You:** Yes, you! By being kind, respectful, and speaking up when something's wrong.

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What You Can Expect at School

- Staff are trained to protect you and know what to do if something goes wrong.
- You'll learn about safety, including online safety, in class.
- There are clear rules about how adults should behave around students.
- If someone acts inappropriately, it will be taken seriously.
- Your personal information is kept private and safe.

What If You're Worried?

If you feel unsafe or something is bothering you:

- Talk to a teacher, counsellor, or any adult you trust at school.
- You can report concerns anonymously.
- You won't get in trouble for speaking up.
- Your safety and wellbeing will always come first.

Your Rights as a Student

You have the right to:

- Be respected and treated kindly.
- Be heard and have your opinions considered.
- Be safe at school and online.
- Get help when you need it.
- Learn in a place that values you.

Working Together

We work with parents, families, and outside agencies like child protection services and the police to make sure you're safe. Everyone is part of the team that protects you.
